Whitby, if you plan to use fireworks this Canada Day - please be considerate of your neighbours and stay safe.


Follow The Laws


- Only light fireworks on July 1 from dusk to 11 p.m.
- Don't litter

Fireworks are not permitted if there is a fire ban in effect. Visit whitby.ca/Fireworks to see if we have one in place on July 1.

Give Space

- Make sure you aren't close to houses. trees, cars. overhead wires or dry grass
- Keep onlookers a safe distance away from the area where the fireworks are discharged
- Set fireworks at a 10-degree angle, pointing away from people









Be Safe

- Appoint one responsible person to light fireworks
- Carefully read and follow the label directions on fireworks packaging
- Use a good firing base such as a pail filled with dirt or sand
- · Keep a water hose or pail of water close by
- Never try to light a firework in your hand or re-light dud fireworks
- Sparkler wires remain hot after burnout, soak them in water immediately
- Always supervise children near fireworks and sparklers
- Always light the fuse at its tip

If someone gets burned, run cool water over the wound for three to five minutes and seek medical attention, if necessary.
